Hand Sanitizer

Hand sanitizer will be located by every usher. We will also have sanitizer before you receive communion. Sanitizer is also located outside the west entrance door to the church for those who need to use it after going to the restroom.

Entering Saint Patrick Parking Lot

You will be greeted by an USHER.

The USHER will greet you and say:

If you want to sit in the church, enter through the main entrance to the church.

If you want to sit in the social hall, enter through the south entrance, the door leading to the offices.

Time the Church Opens

You will be able to enter the church half hour prior to the beginning of Mass.

If you do not want to wait in line, please arrive as earlier rather than later.

Propping doors?

If the USHERS at the entrances are busy attending someone else, you will be required to wait patiently in line, outside the church and 6 ft. apart, until you you are called.

Sitting in the Church vs Social Hall

Church

You will ONLY be able to sit in the church space if you use the main entrance. If church capacity reaches its limit you will be required to sit in the social hall and vice versa.

Social Hall

To sit in the social hall you will need to enter through the south entrance door.

If you go through this door, you will ONLY be able to sit in the Social Hall (unless no more seating is available).

Sitting in the Church

Two USHERS will greet you in the vestibule.

A GIFT BASKET will be located near the USHER for you to drop off your gift.


Please, be ready to just drop off your gift by preparing ahead of time.

Entering to sit in the Church

The USHERS will greet you and ask you how many people are in your party. This information is necessary to be able to make the best use of the church space.

They will look at the sitting chart and availability. They will point you in the direction of your seats.

An USHER might be inside the church space to guide you.




TOTAL CAPACITY 101

Entering to sit in the Church


The benches are marked from A through H. You can find these markings on the back pew of each column of pews.

Seats are marked in a letter number combination. These numbers will be found on the floor, right next to your seat.


As you can see in the picture, seat A3 is marked red, and sit H2 is marked pink, and sit D4 is marked green.



Can you find seat F4, D1 and C4?



Seat F4 is shown in RED. Seat D1 is shown in GREEN. Seat C4 is shown in PINK.



Entering to sit in the Social Hall

To sit in the social hall you will need to enter through the south entrance door, the door that leads you to the offices.

If you go through this door, you will ONLY be able to sit in the Social Hall (unless no more seating is available).

The reason is to eliminate people from running into each other.

Entering to sit in the Social Hall

As you enter you will notice arrows guiding you to where you are supposed to go.

Entering to sit in the Social Hall

An USHER will be waiting for you as you enter the social hall. The usher will greet you and ask you how many are in your party. The usher will then point you in the direction to where are supposed to sit.

A gift basket will be present and some hand sanitizer as well.

Another USHER might be available to help you find your sit.

The Social Hall Layout




Receiving Communion

Father Kevin will distribute communion one column of pews at a time. He will begin with the Far Left column of pews and move his way to the right (see the picture in the next slide).



Receiving Communion

Far Left→ Green; Center Left→ Red; Center Right→ Pink; Far Right→ Yellow



Guidelines for Receiving Communion

People will make a line spaced 6 ft apart from each other.

People who will be receiving communion on the tongue will be asked to be the last to receive communion.

People should use hand sanitizer provided in at the front of each aisle for receiving communion.

At the Spanish Mass, ushers will guide the process and no line will be formed.

Exiting the Church

Fr. Kevin will ask people not to linger inside the church and to remain 6 ft. apart from each other while exiting.

At the Spanish Mass, ushers will help dismiss people. Dismissal will be by pews, beginning from the last pews and moving forward.

Doors will be propped open at the dismissal of Mass by the ushers.

Using the Restrooms

People are encouraged to use the restroom as little as possible.

Hand sanitizer will be provided just outside the west entrance to the church area.

Limit the use of the restroom to one person (or family) at a time.

Other things to keep in mind

Please exit the way you came in.

All other entrances will remain locked.

No one is allowed to stay in the church aside from the people who will be helping to disinfect and are serving in some capacity.

Keep children from running around. It is for their safety and other's safety. We are in all this together!
