## April 27, 2025 – Pope Francis – Part 1 of 3

The news of Pope Francis' death this past Monday morning inspired much personal reflection on his Papacy and his legacy. Certainly, only time will tell what will be his "lasting legacy." And his Papacy was not without controversy. Pope Francis did, at times, say or do things that struck many as imprudent, unhelpfully ambiguous, or just plain frustrating. Yet regardless of these things, he is still our spiritual father whom we love and honor. And, while I shared some of those criticisms and frustrations about Pope Francis, there have also been many things that he has said or done that I have personally found beautiful, hopeful, and inspiring. So, here is a list of fourteen of these things, which I listed in approximate chronological order. I will be sharing these fourteen things over the course of the next few columns. Here are the first three:

1) Pope Francis washes the feet of prison inmates - Holy Thursday, 2013: As Pope Francis was elected on March 13 of 2013, he celebrated his first Holy Week as Pope only a couple of weeks later. What was striking was that our new Pope chose to celebrate Holy Thursday in one of the prisons in Rome and wash the feet of the prison inmates. (A tradition he has continued over the course of his Papacy).

2) "Church is a Field Hospital" – Sept. 2013: In an interview with the Jesuits (the religious order to which he belonged before he became Pope), Pope Francis said, "*I see the church as a field hospital after battle. It is useless to ask a seriously injured person if he has high cholesterol and about the level of his blood sugars! You have to heal his wounds. Then we can talk about everything else. Heal the wounds, heal the wounds.*" This very striking image of the Church became very popular among Catholics, or at least among seminarians studying to become priests (which I was at the time), as we spoke about what it means to be Church and to live the Church's Mission.

3) "The Joy of the Gospel" (Apostolic Exhortation) - Nov. 2013: Pope Francis wrote an "Apostolic Exhortation" on "ON THE PROCLAMATION OF THE GOSPEL IN TODAY'S WORLD." This is something we read for our "Theology of Priesthood" class as we prepared to be ordained and begin our mission as priests. While there is much that could be said about this Exhortation of Pope Francis, one thing that was particularly highlighted was the importance of "Spiritual accompaniment." That is, the idea of meeting people where they are at and "accompanying them" at their pace towards Jesus Christ and the truth and joy of his Gospel. These two themes of "Spiritual accompaniment" and the image of the Church as a "field hospital for sinners" (see above), I think help us to understand much of what Pope Francis was trying to do throughout his Papacy.

## 27 de Abril – Papa Francisco – Parte 1 de 3

La noticia de la muerte del Papa Francisco el lunes por la mañana me inspiró a reflexionar sobre su papado y legado. Ciertamente, sólo el tiempo dirá cuál será su "legado inmortal". Su papado no estuvo exento de polémica. El Papa Francisco, a veces, dijo o hizo cosas que a muchos les pareció imprudentes, inútilmente ambiguas o simplemente frustrantes. Sin embargo, a pesar de esto, él sigue siendo nuestro padre espiritual a quien amamos y honramos. Y, aunque compartí algunas de esas críticas y frustraciones; al mismo tiempo, ha dicho o hecho muchas cosas que he encontrado hermosas, esperanzadoras e inspiradoras. Entonces, en el transcurso de las próximas columnas, enumeraré catorce de estas cosas en aproximado orden cronológico. A continuación, las tres primeras:

**1) Jueves Santo, 2013 — El Papa Francisco lava los pies de presos:** Cuando el Papa Francisco fue elegido el 13 de marzo de 2013, sólo un par de semanas después celebró su primera Semana Santa como Papa. Lo sorprendente fue que nuestro nuevo Papa eligió celebrar el Jueves Santo en una de las cárceles romanas y lavar los pies a los reclusos. (Tradición que ha continuado a lo largo de su papado).

**2) Sept., 2013 — "La Iglesia es un hospital de campaña":** En una entrevista con los Jesuitas (la orden religiosa a la que pertenecía antes de convertirse en Sumo Pontífice), el Papa dijo, "*Veo a la iglesia como un hospital de campaña después de una batalla. ¡Es inútil preguntarle a una persona gravemente lesionada si tiene el colesterol alto o sobre el nivel de azúcar en la sangre! Debes curar sus heridas. Después podremos hablar de todo lo demás. Cura las heridas,cura las heridas.*" Esta imagen tan impactante de la Iglesia se hizo extremadamente popular entre los católicos, o al menos entre los seminaristas estudiando para ser sacerdotes (quien yo era en ese momento), mientras hablábamos de lo que significa ser Iglesia y vivir la Misión de la Iglesia.

**3) Nov., 2013 — "La Alegría del Evangelio" (Exhortación Apostólica):** El Papa Francisco escribió una Exhortación Apostólica "SOBRE EL ANUNCIO DEL EVANGELIO EN EL MUNDO ACTUAL". Leímos esto en nuestra clase de Teología del Sacerdocio mientras nos preparábamos para ser ordenados y comenzar nuestra misión. Si bien hay mucho que podría decirse sobre esta Exhortación del Papa Francisco, Una cosa que se destacó particularmente fue la importancia del acompañamiento espiritual. Es decir, la idea de encontrar a las personas allí donde se encuentran y "acompañarlas" a su paso hacia Jesucristo y hacia la verdad y la alegría de su Evangelio. Estos dos temas, "acompañamiento espiritual" y la imagen de la Iglesia como "un hospital de campaña para los pecadores" (lee arriba), creo que nos ayuda a entender mucho de lo que el Papa Francisco estaba tratando de hacer a lo largo de su papado.
