There is a particular emphasis on *healing*, of the ways that God the Holy Spirit wants to bring healing into your life on all levels: physical, emotional, and spiritual.

This parish mission will be happening in April at **St. Thomas Aquinas Parish in Ames, Iowa**. The mission is from 6 p.m.–8:30 p.m. each night. The night includes singing of praise and worship music, two talks by priests, and then a time of prayer. The time of prayer includes Eucharistic Adoration, opportunity for confession, and an opportunity to come forward and be prayed over by a prayer team. I encourage you to try and come to the event, whether it's just for one night or all three.

June 2: The second event I want to invite you is the National Eucharistic Procession that has been crossing the country for this year Eucharistic Revival. This National Eucharistic Procession started at the headwaters of the Mississippi and is making its way to Indianapolis, Ind. for the National Eucharistic Congress. On **Sun. June 2, it will be passing through Rochester, Minn.** – about a 2-hour drive from here. I think it is a great opportunity to connect with this national Eucharistic event. The day will include time of prayer before the Blessed Sacrament, processing through the city or Rochester in prayerful procession with the Blessed Sacrament, as well as Mass with Bishop Robert Barron. **If this is something you are interested in attending, please let the parish office know ... if there is enough interest, we will look to get a bus to attend the events of that day.** I would love to fill a bus to go up to the events! Take time to think about the Eucharist. God himself became so small that just two fingers can hold him in the host. A small child or a dying person can receive him. The Eucharist is beyond understanding, to be accepted only in deep faith and love. Jesus deliberately left us the Eucharist to help us remember all that he came to do. In the Gospels, there are only a few words describing his passion and death. These few words – which we could so easily forget – tell us that he was crowned with thorns, scourged, and spat upon. The Gospels avoid lengthy explanations in their description of the passion, telling us that he was scourged by not how many times or even what the whip was made of. But Jesus understands our human nature. He understands that when something is far from the eyes it can be far from the heart as well. Just imagine what life would be like without the Eucharist. What would there be to make us love him? What would there be to make us give up everything? I don't think any of us would be here without the Eucharist.
