Feb. 23, 2025 – The Church on Immigration

Part 2: Teachings from the Bishops of the United States

To help us understand more fully the Church's Teaching on Immigration, I drew upon an article by Barb Arland-Fye from the Davenport Diocese's Paper, *The Catholic Messenger*. Here is compiled together the Church's teaching on immigration as articulated by the U.S. Catholic Bishops and the Iowa Catholic Bishops.

What is the Church's Stance on Border Control?

The United States also has a responsibility to prevent individuals with a history of violent crime from entering the country, as their presence could undermine a community's peace and security. The Church teaches that the protection of society is a legitimate concern of the state and measures to ensure this protection must be just and humane. (*Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship, USCCB Pastoral Letter, Nov. 2023*).

While "The Church recognizes the right of a sovereign state to control its borders in furtherance of the common good, it also recognizes the right of human beings to migrate so that they can realize their God-given rights. While the sovereign state may impose reasonable limits on immigration, the common good is not served when the basic human rights of the individual are violated. (*Strangers Now Longer, 39, USCCB Pastoral Letter, Jan. 2003*)

What do the US Bishops say about immigration reform?

The U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) has published a resourced called "Catholic Elements of Immigration Reform." The Bishops say that safeguarding American Communities and upholding the rule of law are laudable goals. At the same time, a country's rights to regulate its borders and enforce immigration laws must be balanced with its responsibilities to uphold the sanctity of human life, respect the God-given dignity of all persons, and enact policies that further the common good. The USCCB document on immigration reform, grounded in Catholic social teaching, includes six elements according to the Iowa Catholic Conference newsletter (Jan. 23, 2025):

- 1) *Enforcement efforts should be targeted, proportional, and humane*
- 2) *Humanitarian protections and due process should be ensured*
- 3) *Long-time residents should have an earned pathway to citizenship*
- 4) *Family Unity should remain a cornerstone in the U.S. System*
- 5) *Legal pathways should be expanded, reliable, and efficient*
- 6) *The root causes of forced migration should be addressed*

Why do immigrants enter our country?

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23 de Feb. 2025 – La postura de la Iglesia en relación a la Inmigración

2da Parte: Enseñanzas de los Obispos de los Estados Unidos

Para ayudarnos a comprender más plenamente la enseñanza de la Iglesia sobre la inmigración, recurrí a un artículo de Barb Arland-Fye del periódico de la diócesis de Davenport, *The Catholic Messenger (El Mensajero Católico)*. Aquí se compila la enseñanza de la Iglesia sobre la inmigración tal como la articulan los obispos católicos de Estados Unidos y los obispos católicos de Iowa.

¿Cuál es la postura de la Iglesia sobre el control fronterizo?

Estados Unidos también tiene la responsabilidad de impedir que personas con antecedentes de delitos violentos entren al país, ya que su presencia podría socavar la paz y la seguridad de una comunidad. La Iglesia enseña que la protección de la sociedad es una preocupación legítima del Estado y las medidas para garantizar esta protección deben ser justas y humanas. — *Formando la conciencia para ser ciudadanos fieles, Carta Pastoral de USCCB, nov. 2023*.

Mientras que "La Iglesia reconoce el derecho de un estado soberano a controlar sus fronteras para promover el bien común; también reconoce el derecho de los seres humanos a migrar para que puedan realizar los derechos que les dio Dios. Si bien el Estado soberano puede imponer límites razonables a la inmigración, el bien común no se beneficia cuando se violan los derechos humanos básicos del individuo. — *Ya no somos extranjeros, 39, Carta Pastoral de USCCB, enero 2003*.

¿Qué dicen los obispos católicos de Estados Unidos sobre la reforma migratoria?

Los obispos católicos de los Estados Unidos (USCCB, por sus siglas en inglés) publicaron un documento llamado "Catholic Elements of Immigration Reform" (Elementos católicos de la reforma migratoria). Los obispos dicen que proteger a las comunidades estadounidenses y defender el estado de derecho son objetivos loables. Al mismo tiempo, los derechos de un país a regular sus fronteras y hacer cumplir las leyes de inmigración deben equilibrarse con sus responsabilidades de defender la santidad de la vida humana, respetar la dignidad dada por Dios a todas las personas y promulgar políticas que promuevan el bien común. El documento de la USCCB sobre la reforma migratoria, basado en la enseñanza social católica, incluye seis elementos según el boletín de la Conferencia Católica de Iowa (enero 23, 2025):

- 1) *Los esfuerzos de cumplimiento deben ser específicos, proporcionales y humanos*
- 2) *Se debe garantizar las protecciones humanitarias y el debido proceso*
- 3) *Los residentes de larga data deberían tener un camino ganado hacia la ciudadanía*
- 4) *La unidad familiar debe seguir siendo una piedra angular en el sistema estadounidense*
- 5) *Las vías legales deben ampliarse, ser confiables y eficientes*
- 6) *Es necesario abordar las causas profundas de la migración forzada*
