Jan. 12, 2025 – Prayer with the Pope this Year!

Did you know that each month, the Pope has a specific prayer intention? He and his Worldwide Prayer Network pray for these intentions. This Prayer Network is present in 92 countries and is made up of more than 22 million Catholics. I invite you to consider including in your own prayers, this year, the Pope's monthly prayer intentions, to share in the world of prayer for the world, and so to be aware of the needs of our brothers and sisters throughout the world. Here are the Pope's monthly prayer intentions for 2025.

JANUARY: For the right to an education. Let us pray for migrants, refugees and those affected by war, that their right to an education, which is necessary to build a better world, might always be respected.

FEBRUARY: For vocations to the priesthood and religious life. Let us pray that the ecclesial community might welcome the desires and doubts of those young people who feel a call to serve Christ's mission in the priesthood and religious life.

MARCH: For families in crisis. Let us pray that broken families might discover the cure for their wounds through forgiveness, rediscovering each other's gifts, even in their differences.

APRIL: For the use of the new technologies. Let us pray that the use of the new technologies will not replace human relationships, will respect the dignity of the person, and will help us face the crises of our times.

MAY: For working conditions. Let us pray that through work, each person might find fulfillment, families might be sustained in dignity, and that society might be humanized.

JUNE: That the world might grow in compassion. Let us pray that each one of us might find consolation in a personal relationship with Jesus, and from his Heart, learn to have compassion on the world.

JULY: For formation in discernment. Let us pray that we might again learn how to discern, to know how to choose paths of life and reject everything that leads us away from Christ and the Gospel.

AUGUST: For mutual coexistence. Let us pray that societies where coexistence seems more difficult might not succumb to the temptation of confrontation for ethnic, political, religious, or ideological reasons.

SEPTEMBER: For our relationship with all of creation. Let us pray that, inspired by Saint Francis, we might experience our interdependence with all creatures who are loved by God and worthy of love and respect.

OCTOBER: For collaboration between different religious traditions. Let us pray that believers in different religious traditions might work together to defend and promote peace, justice and human fraternity.

NOVEMBER: For the prevention of suicide. Let us pray that those who are struggling with suicidal thoughts might find the support, care and love they need in their community, and be open to the beauty of life.

DECEMBER: For Christians in areas of conflict. Let us pray that Christians living in areas of war or conflict, especially in the Middle East, might be seeds of peace, reconciliation, and hope.

A continuación, las intenciones de oración mensual del Papa para el año 2025:

ENERO: Por el derecho a la educación. Oremos para que migrantes, refugiados y afectados por las guerras vean siempre respetado su derecho a la educación, necesaria para construir un mundo mejor.

FEBRERO: Por las vocaciones a la vida sacerdotal y religiosa. Oremos para que la comunidad eclesial acoga los deseos y las dudas de los jóvenes que sienten la llamada a servir la misión de Cristo en la vida sacerdotal y religiosa.

MARZO: Por las familias en crisis. Oremos para que las familias divididas encuentren en el perdón la curación de sus heridas, redescubriendo incluso en sus diferencias las riquezas de cada uno.

ABRIL: Por el uso de las nuevas tecnologías. Oremos para que el uso de las nuevas tecnologías no reemplace las relaciones humanas, respete la dignidad de las personas, y ayude a afrontar las crisis de nuestro tiempo.

MAYO: Por las condiciones de trabajo. Oremos para que a través del trabajo se realice cada persona, se sostengan las familias con dignidad y se humanice la sociedad.

JUNIO: Para crecer en la compasión por el mundo. Oremos para que cada uno de nosotros encuentre consuelo en la relación personal con Jesús y aprenda de su Corazón la compasión por el mundo.

JULIO: Por la formación para el discernimiento. Oremos para que aprendamos cada vez más a discernir, saber elegir caminos de vida y rechazar todo lo que nos aleje de Cristo y del Evangelio.

AGOSTO: Por la convivencia común. Oremos para que las sociedades en que la convivencia parece más difícil no sucumban a la tentación del enfrentamiento por motivos étnicos, políticos, religiosos o ideológicos.

SEPTIEMBRE: Por nuestra relación con toda la creación. Oremos para que, inspirados por San Francisco, experimentemos nuestra interdependencia con todas las criaturas, amadas por Dios y dignas de amor y respeto.

OCTUBRE: Por la colaboración entre las distintas tradiciones religiosas. Oremos para que creyentes de distintas tradiciones religiosas trabajemos juntos para defender y promover la paz, la justicia y la fraternidad humana.

NOVIEMBRE: Por la prevención del suicidio. Oremos para que las personas que están combatiendo con pensamientos suicidas encuentren en su comunidad el apoyo, el cuidado y el amor que necesitan y se abran a la belleza de la vida.

DICIEMBRE: Por los cristianos en contextos de conflicto. Oremos para que los cristianos que viven en contextos de guerra o conflicto, especialmente en Medio Oriente, sean semillas de paz, reconciliación y esperanza.

and our rebate from all sales were \$2,515.66.

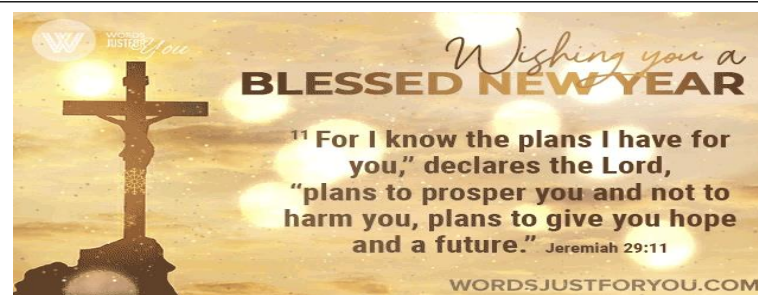
This remains our best fundraiser and with more church

Heating Cost Assistance for Low-Income Households

The Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) is a federally-funded program designed to assist low-income families in Iowa to meet the cost of home heating by providing a one-time payment to the heating utility. Homeowners and renters are eligible within the federal poverty guidelines. Applications are accepted on a first-come, first-served basis from November 1 - April 30 of each year. **Individuals may apply for the program at the local Community Action Agency in your county.**
