October 6 – Spiritual Themes of Autumn

I love autumn! The cool season of autumn and the changing of leaves has always felt to me like a season of great anticipation, of new beginnings — the start of a new school year and seeing beloved friends whom I had missed all summer, the beginning of exciting new adventures, the harvest being brought in. I love the flavors of the season: spiced apple cider and all pumpkin-flavored things. Also, the exciting thrill of the coming of winter, a season that I, unlike many people, really love.

But in addition to all these, I also love the spiritual “themes” woven into our experience of this season. Through the celebrations of different spiritual feasts and saints (including some of my favorites, Sts. Francis and Thérèse), the Church holds up to us different facets of the Great Divine Mystery of God as revealed in Jesus Christ. As the harvest is brought in, as the days get cooler and darker, and the natural world seems to enter a the temporary “death” of winter, people’s minds tend to raise up to thoughts of death, the netherworld, and thus the supernatural.

The Church therefore holds up to us angels and saints. The angels — spiritual beings that guard and protect us and help us to know the will of God — we commemorate on Sept. 29 with the Feast of St. Michael and the archangels; and Oct. 2, the Feast of Guardian Angels.

On Nov. 1 we celebrate the Great Feast of All Saints, remembering fellow human beings who have walked through and struggled in this world, and now reign with the Lord in heavenly glory, and who pray and intercede for us. This reminds us too, to pray for souls that are passing into heavenly paradise; and thus, we celebrate All Souls Day on Nov. 2.

And in between the feasts of angels and saints comes this month of October, the Month of the Rosary, due to the Feast Day of Our Lady of the Rosary on Oct. 7. This day is also called the Feast of Our Lady of Victory, due to the victory at the Battle of Lepanto, when Pope St. Pius V called for all of Europe to pray the rosary for protection against the invading forces of the Ottoman Empire. Here in the United States, forty or so years ago, the bishops also called for this month to be a prayer for the protection of the dignity and sanctity of every human life, thus “Respect Life Month.” This is partly because the cause for life has been particularly entrusted to the prayers of the Blessed Mother.

Throughout this month I will be sharing a bit more about the Rosary, as the Month of the Rosary, as well as addressing a few things around the themes of respect of life. More to come on this in future bulletin columns!

¡Amo el otoño! Tanto la temporada fría como el cambio de color de las hojas, siempre lo he sentido como un tiempo de gran anticipación, de nuevos comienzos — el inicio de un nuevo año escolar, volver a ver a los queridos amigos que extrañé durante el verano, nuevas y emocionantes aventuras, el comienzo de la cosecha. Me encantan los sabores de esta temporada: sidra de manzana especiada y todo lo que sepa a calabaza. También, la anticipación de la llegada del invierno que, como poca gente, lo disfruto.

Pero además de todo esto, me encantan los “temas” espirituales entretreídos en nuestra experiencia de esta temporada. Por medio de las celebraciones de diferentes fiestas espirituales y santos (incluyendo algunos de mis favoritos, Stos. Francisco y Teresa), la Iglesia nos muestra diferentes facetas del Gran Misterio Divino de Dios revelado en Jesucristo. A medida que se recoge la cosecha, los días se vuelven más fríos y oscuros, y el mundo natural parece entrar en la “muerte” temporal del invierno, la mente de las personas tiende a elevarse hacia pensamientos de muerte, del inframundo y, por lo tanto, lo sobrenatural.

La Iglesia nos presenta, entonces, ángeles y santos. Conmemoramos a los ángeles — seres espirituales que nos guardan, protegen y nos ayudan a conocer la voluntad de Dios — Santos arcángeles Miguel, Gabriel y Rafael el 29 de sept.; y el 2 de oct., a los Santos ángeles custodios.

El 1 de nov. celebramos a Todos los Santos, recordando a aquellos seres humanos que han caminado y luchado en este mundo, y ahora reinan con el Señor en la gloria celestial, orando e intercediendo por nosotros. Esto nos recuerda también de orar por las almas que pasan al paraíso celestial y, por lo tanto, celebramos el Día de los Fieles Difuntos el 2 de nov.

Y entre las fiestas de ángeles y santos, viene este mes de octubre, llamado el Mes del Rosario gracias a la Fiesta de Nuestra Señora del Rosario el 7 de oct. Este día también es conocido como el de Nuestra Señora de la Victoria, conmemorando una victoria naval en la batalla de Lepanto, cuando el Papa San Pío V pidió que toda Europa rezara el rosario para protegerse de las fuerzas invasoras del Imperio Otomano.

Aquí en los Estados Unidos, cuarenta años atrás, los obispos pidieron que este mes fuese de oración por la protección de la dignidad y la santidad de toda vida humana; por lo tanto, el “Mes Respetemos la Vida”. Esto se debe en parte a que la causa de la vida ha sido particularmente confiada a las oraciones de la Santísima Madre.

Como es el Mes del Rosario, estaré compartiendo un poco más sobre el Rosario; además, abordaré algunas cosas en torno a los temas del respeto a la vida. ¡Habrá más información sobre esto en futuras columnas del boletín!
